Schedule of classes for the 2024 Staffordshire County Show Overall theme for all displays, entries and marquee:

"Alice in Wonderland"

Exhibits to be staged by members between 8:30am and 11:30 am on Tuesday 28th May.

Late entries will not be accepted on the setting up day. **Exhibits must not be removed before 5:00pm on Thursday 30th May.** The Committee accepts no responsibility for exhibits not collected by 6pm.

Notes for Exhibitors

All Classes – Exhibits must fit the class theme

Craft Exhibits

- 1. Exhibits must not have been entered on an SFWI County Show previously
- 2. All exhibits should be in pristine condition and made within the last 2 years
- 3. All Staging is to be free standing back boards may be used but will not be provided.

All entries will be judged by the 2021 Edition of "On with the Show". Judges decisions are final.

Co-operative Classes

In both classes, the table will be covered in green fabric and exhibits will be viewed from the front. Each WI may enter more than one exhibit in cooperative classes.

Class 1: Co-operative Produce

Eat Me, Drink Me

Produce needs to reflect the theme of Alice in Wonderland

Three items of produce using 3 different methods.

One of the items must be a cordial.

Accessories may be used. A base board of not more than 76 cm/30 " wide and 61cm/24" deep may be used, height unlimited. All items will be moved for judging and will be replaced uncovered. The entry must be the work of more than one member.

Items will be judged following the individual "On with the Show" criteria. Staging and Interpretation scores will also be given to create an overall max score of 100.

- 1. Cordial should be presented in a clear glass bottle with a screw lid leaving a 12- 25 mm headspace.
- 2. Tops can be metal or plastic and can be recycled as long as they have been sterilized. Swing- stopped bottles with new seals and corks are also acceptable.
- 3. On with the Show states that cordial must contain fruit tissue

Class 2: Co-operative Handicraft

The Mad Hatter's Tea Party

Three items of craft using 3 different methods.

Craft items themselves needs to reflect the theme of Alice in Wonderland, not just the materials they are made from.

Accessories may be used. A base board of not more than 76 cm/30 " wide and 61cm/24" deep may be used, height unlimited. All items will be moved for judging and will be replaced uncovered. The entry must be the work of more than one member.

Items will be judged following the individual "On with the Show" criteria. Staging and Interpretation scores will also be given to create an overall max score of 100.

Classes for Individual SFWI Members

N.B. The maximum number of entries is two per person per class, **except for photography which is four entries per W.I.**

Novice classes are open to members who have not won a first place in that class at a previous County Show.

Exhibits will be judged from the front.

Space allowed 61cm/24" square, height unlimited. Accessories may be used. The table will be covered in green fabric.

Class 10: Floral Art – Foliage to Dominate

Through the Looking Glass

A foliage based exhibit to reflect the theme of "Through the Looking Glass"

Grasses may be used in this exhibit.

Exhibits will be judged from the front.

Space allowed 61cm/24" square, height unlimited. Accessories may be used. The table will be covered in green fabric.

Class 11: Novice Floral Art

The Dormouse's teapot

A floral exhibit presented in a teapot.

The teapot for this exhibit should be no larger than a standard teapot (approx. 1L/2 pint). Space allowed 61cm/24" square, height unlimited.

Children's Class

Class 12: Children's class

A Mad Hat

A Hat worthy of the Mad Hatter.

The hat base does not need to be hand made to qualify for entry.

This class is in two sections, up to 6 years and 7-12 years of age. All entrants will receive a small prize.

Photography

Class 13: Photography

Wonderland

A photograph to reflect the theme of "Wonderland".

The photograph is to be presented on a **plain white mount** measuring $8" \times 10"$ (22.5cm x 25.5cm) **including the mount**. Photographs should **not be portraits.** No professional photography is allowed in this class. Please provide a suitable stand. Photographs must have been taken by the entrant.

N.B. Oversized, unmounted and framed photographs will not be judged. Photographs must not have been entered in a previous County Show. <u>This class is restricted to a maximum of four entries per W.I.</u>

Class 14: Art

Curiouser and Curiouser

This is an open class. Create a picture reflecting the theme of "Curiouser and Curiouser." The picture should be suitable for hanging. It can be in any medium but any work on paper should be framed and glazed. No entry is to have any side more than 61cm/24 in when glazed. A table easel should be provided. N.B. Over sized entries will not be judged.

Guidelines

- 1. Entry fees are stated on the accompanying entry forms
- 2. All entries will be marked in accordance with NFWI publication "On with the Show" 2021 edition. Details of how marks are awarded can be found in this document. Please refer to NFWI / My WI for information on how to download this publication.

Standard of workmanship – 20 marks per item

Staging and Interpretation – 20 marks each

Gold Stars are awarded for any item gaining 20 marks

Silver Stars are awarded for any item gaining 19 or 19 ½ marks

- 3. The rules for produce in the current version of "On with the Show" will be strictly adhered to so judges will not accept items that deteriorate quickly when not refrigerated. This includes paté, fish, shellfish, yoghurt, meat, cream, raw eggs or cream cheese.
- 4. Due to the possibility of humidity in the marquee, care should be taken when using sugar paste, royal icing, paper craft or any other material that may deteriorate in damp conditions.

Trophies will be presented by the Chairman at a special event later in the year. Classes 1,2,3,4,6,7,9,10 and 11 are sponsored by the Staffordshire Agricultural Society.

All entry forms and fees must reach SFWI offices by 2nd May 2024. If after submitting an entry WI's, groups or individuals find they are unable to take part, please contact the office as soon as possible.

For insurance purposes, SFWI will not be held responsible for any items used in displays. If valuable items are used, they will need to be insured by the exhibitor.
