## **EVERY ACTION COUNTS: -**

Autumn is upon us and the gardens need a tidy-up .... It is time to think about hedgehogs, now their hibernation is near.



Please consider making a safe spot for a hedgehog - a broken terracotta pot on its side part filled with dry leaves left in a sheltered spot would be ideal.

If you are thinking of having a bonfire, check that there are no hedgehogs tucked in the base before it is lit.

If you haven't seen a hedgehog in your garden, is it because there is no access under the fence? A hedgehog highway is easily created - a 13cm x 13cm hole in a fence panel or wire mesh is sufficient.

Spread the word to your neighbours and get the whole road involved.

# Following in the Footsteps of Richard III

What a Grand Day Out was had by members who went on the Bosworth & Leicester trip organised by the Education & Public Affairs sub-Committee.

There was role play at Bosworth Heritage Centre to understand the strategy of the Battle that claimed Richard's life plus an interesting talk on the politics of the time, and the role that women played.

Then it was on to Leicester to the Richard III Visitor Centre where atmospheric holograms gave context to his life and an exhibition showed how the search for his body was conducted - and verified. We were able to view the actual grave site, looking down through glass into the excavation in the famous Council car park with an image of how his body was lying.

To finish the day, there was a guided talk at Leicester Cathedral - just across the path from where Richard was found - to see his tomb and amazing stained glass windows dedicated to his life, and death.
